INTRODUCTION

In the previous modules, we discussed how to write a notice and an advertisement. Like these two, a poster is another form of communication that aims to get your points across quickly. Let us first understand what a poster is and why we write it.

WHAT IS A POSTER?

Poster is a placard displayed in a public place announcing or advertising something. In simple words, a poster is a combination of notices, advertisements and invitations. It generally comprises both the pictorial presentation and the written content of the topic.

PURPOSE OF WRITING POSTERS

The purpose of writing a poster is to create social awareness about issues related to current problems or needs. It also extends public invitations and displays notices. You must have noticed big posters in your city with some kind of social messages, like 'plastic ban', 'save water' etc.

WRITING POSTERS

Writing a poster is not easy as it should be done in a way that attracts readers' attention, excites their imagination and influences their minds. To achieve these, you must be careful with the layout, content and expression of a poster while designing it. Let's understand these components in detail.

Layout

- Eye-catching and visually attractive
- Title: It's the title that a reader would notice first. It motivates the reader to check the poster in detail. Write a catchy and suggestive title in the form of a slogan/short verse, i.e., '*Dowry A Social Evil and a Curse'*, '*Books Our Best Friend'*, etc.
- Background and Colour: Use letters of different size and shape. You should not use dark background unless you have images and texts in the right contrast. In this case, you should keep light shades as background. Use different colours for the title and the message.
- Images/figures: You can use images to make your poster attractive but place it appropriately with the text matter. You can also make sketches or use matchstick figures. If you are making posters by hand, you can paste cut-images from newspapers and magazines to make it more appealing.

Content

The content of a poster includes

- The details associated with the theme of a poster. The details can be the message you want to convey.
- The message you want to convey
- Essential details like time, venue, date, contact information, etc. (if applicable).
- Name(s) of the issuing authority, organization, etc.

Expression

- Organize the matter properly and make sure that the language used in the poster is appropriate and accurate.
- Do not use jargons or use short forms of words as they create confusion to the readers.
- Do not exceed the word limit of 50 words.

Look at the poster below designed by a fitness trainer to emphasize the importance of exercise in maintaining physical and mental fitness.






