


2. Click on “Sign up now”, if using it for the first time.





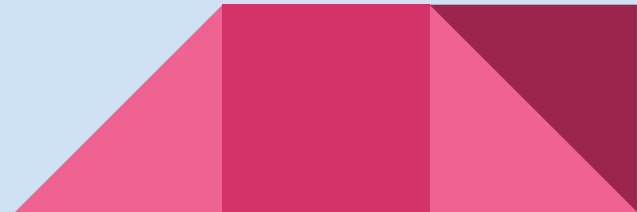
